Breakdown of Classes Per Week

Grade 3

English: 10 Periods. This includes Reading, Grammar, Composition, Spelling, Handwriting, and Vocabulary. Each area is tested and reported separately. On the report card, an average English score will also be reported. It is important to note that this is not a straight average; sub-subjects are weighted differently depending on grade level.

Math: 9 Periods. Memorization of multiplication facts and division facts is the biggest project for third graders. This project may involve help from home. We give small amounts of practice time and timed tests in school. Addition and subtraction facts should be mastered at the beginning of the year, so we can focus on multiplication and division facts. We multiply with two and three digit numbers and introduce long division. We touch base with measurement, fractions, and decimals. We incorporate story problems into all areas of math that we study.

Social Studies: 3 Periods. The textbook is called From Sea to Shining Sea. We will always read the material together, and then a worksheet or activity may be sent home to review the material. If you have anything to contribute, we would love it.



Science: 3 Periods. Science is taught in two sections: Systems and Variables and Populations. System and Variables will be taught in the first two terms, and Populations will be taught during term three. The SCIS science is a hands-on, experiment-based science program so class participation is vital. Science also includes nutrition and health.

World Language: 5 Periods. Students take classes in Spanish in the four language learning skills: reading, writing, listening and speaking.

Physical Education: 1 Period. Physical education includes various individual and team sports. The emphasis is on lifetime fitness and cooperative play. Throughout the program we promote the values of individual effort, teamwork and sportsmanship.

Art: 1 Period. Students are expected to try their best. Artwork is based on drawing and painting from direct observation. Projects are theme based, and although students work individually, their work may contribute to a group project.

Music 1 Period. Grade 3 will spend one period per week in music class. The music curriculum includes a study of the eight elements of music: dynamics, rhythm, pitch, tone, color, tempo, texture, form, and style, through singing, listening, visual media, theory games, children's literature, creative movement, and playing classroom instruments.

Computer: 1 Period. Keyboarding skills and other activities relating to the curriculum. Students may have the opportunity to take Accelerated Reader tests during computer class.

Snack time occurs during the morning break. Your child should bring a healthy snack and drink each day. Please do not send candy, chips, or pop to school.

Friday Folders

A folder will be sent home on Fridays containing papers and tests from the week. It will also contain the Weekly Update telling you about what has been happening and what you can look forward to in the days ahead. Folders will be placed in the student's backpack and should be returned to school on Mondays.
